CAIR-PA MUSLIMS ANXIOUS TO FILL EMPTY SEATS ON CITY COUNCIL BY ALIYA Z. KHABIR

City Hall- As American Muslims make history in U.S Congress and other elections wins all over the country, Philadelphia continues to add to its list of Muslim public officials.

Sheriff Street, son of current Philadelphia Mayor John Street, has expressed interest at an occupied council at large seat.

Street is an Associate with the law firm of Wolf, Block, Schorr and Solis-Cohen LLP where he has worked in the Government Assisted/Affordable Housing Practice Group. In addition to affordable housing work, Mr. Street 's practice currently includes working with the Real Estate and Government Relations practices at WolfBlock. He is currently a member of the American, Pennsylvania, Philadelphia and National Bar Associations as well as a member of the Philadelphia Barristers Association, for which he served as a board member in 2002.

Mr. Street is a member of the 251st graduating class of Central High School where he served as president of the student body. He graduated *cum laude* from Morehouse College with a B.A. in Business Administration with a concentration in Finance. At Morehouse, Mr. Street served as President of the Student Senate and was an Academic All-American track and field athlete. In 1999, Mr. Street graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Law School where he served as president of the Penn Law Democrats. In July of 2000, he was admitted to the Pennsylvania Bar.

Competition will be tough. He faces Marc Stier of Neighborhood Networks and Derek Green, chief legislative aide to Councilwoman Marian Tasco. Many think Street may be in for an easy win because of his obvious name recognition. However, street is no stranger to the fickle Philadelphia election process. He's leaving no stone unturned, raising money and building a war chest that would put Bush himself to shame.

Hamzaa Yusef, professionally known as Mr. Curtis Jones, Jr. may face Councilwoman Carol Ann Campbell in the 4th District election. The district area Yusef seeks to represent covers the West Philadelphia to Roxborough. Yusef is currently president of the Philadelphia Commercial Development Corporation.

A member of the Mayor John F. Street 's Administration, Mr. Jones has served in city government throughout the past seven mayoral administrations. A noted expert on community-based economic development, Yusef has served in various public and private sector positions for more than a decade.

Appointed in 1987 by Philadelphia Mayor W. Wilson Goode, Mr. Jones served as Deputy Director of Finance and Staff Director of the Minority Business Enterprise Council. Under his leadership, minorities, women, and disabled business entities received more than \$583,000,000 in municipal contract opportunities.

Yusef has completed course study in Boston University 's ACCA program. He has a Master's Degree in Contract Compliance from the University of Alabama . In addition, he attended the University of Pennsylvania 's Fels School of Government. Neither candidate has officially announced their candidacy, however both are expected o make announcements by the end of the year.

CAIR-PHILLY- HAJJ'S UNIVERSAL CONCEPTS FOR ALL MANKIND

As the yearly epic journey of a lifetime is about to begin, let us reflect on the enormity of the very simple and basic concepts that are forever imbedded in the Hajj- or the yearly pilgrimage to Makkah.



AN URGENT APEAL TO ALL IN THE DELAWARE VALLEY

If we look at recent events throughout the country we can see a clear pattern of insensitivity and ignorance being leveled against Islam and Muslims.

In a November column, In today's Philadelphia Daily News, commentator Michael Smerconish - radio host at 1210 WPHT the Big Talker - wrote the following disturbing commentary. In it, he describes passages from fiction author Nelson Demille's new book, "Wild Fire." The author states: "In 'Wild Fire,' I pose that we have something very similar to MAD. Meaning, that if a nuclear bomb went off in America, the presumption of guilt against Islamic terrorists would be very strong; we wouldn't need the proof, we'd never have the proof. We would automatically launch against the nation of Islam, specifically against the cities of Mecca and Medina, and other places like Damascus where we don't care for the government, and this would be a deterrent against a nuclear bomb going off in America." CAIR-Philly sent an immediate action alert to our members and mobilized a letter writing campaign of which at least 2 were published in response.

The Maryland and Virginia chapter of the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR-MD/VA) today called on Muslims and other people of conscience in Northern Virginia to contact GOP Reps. Frank Wolf and Tom Davis and urge them to repudiate recent anti-Muslim remarks by Rep. Virgil Goode (R-VA).

CAIR-MD/VA says Northern Virginia has a large population of Muslim voters who are concerned about a recent letter Goode sent to constituents slamming the planned use of a Quran for the ceremonial swearing-in of Keith Ellison, the first Muslim elected to Congress. (No religious texts of any kind are used for the official swearing-in ceremony.)

"I do not subscribe to using the Koran in any way," wrote Goode.
"The Muslim Representative from Minnesota was elected by the voters of that district and if American citizens don't wake up and adopt the Virgil Goode position on immigration there will likely be many more Muslims elected to office and demanding the use of the Koran."

Goode also decried the growth of the American Muslim community. He wrote, "I fear that in the next century we will have many more Muslims in the United States if we do not adopt the strict immigration policies that I believe are to preserve the values and beliefs traditional to the United States of America." (Keith Ellison has traced his family's roots in America to the year 1742.)

A number of Democratic leaders have repudiated Goode's

A number of Democratic leaders have repudiated Goode's Islamophobic remarks. But aside from mild rebukes from Sen. John W. Warner (R-VA) and Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC), GOP officials have remained silent on the issue.

The White House said "no judgments have been made" as to whether President Bush will condemn Goode's comments or those of Dennis Prager, a presidential appointee to the governing board of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum who sparked the Quran oath controversy.

These are just 2 recent examples of the unadulterated attacks on Muslims and Islam in the public arena. CAIR-Philly is committed to working with and in the community to enhancing the understanding about Islam so situations such as these never occur. To support:
