### **The Year of the Plagues Jacob Bender, Executive Director**

One hundred years ago, 680,000 Americans died from the Spanish Flu Pandemic that ravaged the United States, with Philadelphia being the worst hit city in the nation. Among the hundreds of thousands who perished from the disease was my grandfather, Yitzak Benderski, who emigrated with his wife and children to America in 1919 seeking to escape the religious persecution and poverty of Czarist Russia.

Reading about the Spanish Flu of the last century has a terrifying ring of familiarity: a murderous disease coming in first, second, and even third waves; the overwhelmed hospitals: the guarantining and loss of human contact; the frenzied quest for a vaccine; and the stench of death in the poor and overcrowded neighborhoods of America's urban centers.

A little over a century after my grandfather's death (he was buried in a mass grave which I have been unable to locate), I now face the perils from our own pandemic, with the last few weeks taken up with endless hours online, and on hold, trying to locate some institution where I could get the Covid-19 vaccination.

The Coronavirus Pandemic has altered our world in innumerable ways, the phrase "the new normal" now the moniker of these strange times. CAIR-Philadelphia, like hundreds of other social justice organizations around the country, was deeply impacted during 2020 by Covid-19 in numerous ways:

- In early March of 2020, after five months of planning, we had to cancel our Annual Banquetour single largest fundraising event of the yearbecause of the spreading pandemic.
- In April, the (Quaker) Friends Center, where we shared the building with 40 other social justice nonprofit organizations, closed its doors because of the Coronavirus Pandemic.

As a result, I and my three co-workers at CAIR-Philadelphia have been working from our homes, and I am sure that, like myself, you have discovered that working remotely has both positive and negative ramifications for one's productivity.

As the coronavirus spread across the country at the start of 2020, CAIR-Philadelphia sprung into action, sending out over a dozen blasts and hosting many webinars on Covid-related topics with medical professionals.

Alas, coronavirus was not the only plague we faced in 2020. The pandemic brought about a dramatic downturn of the American economy - our second plague — not seen since the Great Depression of the 1930s, adding another level of anxiety and urgency to our work.

It is in economy stressed times like these that have historically given rise to scapegoating and bigotry. Thus American xenophobia, the hatred of non-white populations, is our third plague and has been one of the defining foundations of American history, stretch ing from slavery to Jim Crow, from lynching to mass incarceration, and from segregation to the denial of the right to vote.

It was thus that we went to the polls on November 3rd, knowing full well that CAIR was standing on the shoulders of Harriet Tubman, Fanny Lou Hammer, John Lewis, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Malcolm X, and thousands of other African Americans who brazed the water cannons and the vicious dogs in their heroic confrontation with the institution of white supremacy.

It was this right to vote that CAIR-Philadelphia made central to its Civic Engagement projects.

### Covid-19 and Civil Rights Timothy N. Welbeck, Civil Rights Attorney

At the end of each year, we report to you about how our office engages in the continued fight against rising Islamophobia, racism, xenophobia, and bigotry. This past year imposed unique challenges for each of us as we navigated the new terrain of the COVID-19 Pandemic. This has meant occasionally having to guide my children through math worksheets and grammar lessons while drafting legal briefs.

This year, our office fielded over 100 oomplaints of harrassement and discrimination. What follows are several examples of CAIR's free legal services provided to American Muslims.

- For example, our office has represented two individuals who suffered hate crimes in public places and we worked with local officials to ensure the perpetrators were brought to justice. In one such instance, a woman experienced a violent attack from another motorist while she was driving near her office in the Philadelphia suburbs. I worked directly with this woman and the local district attorney's office to successfully identify and bring charges against offending individual.
- In a similar instance, CAIR helped identify an individual who attacked his neighbor and used slurs that demeaned his faith and national origin. Our office worked with local law enforcement and the local district attorney's office to identify the attacker and ensure he was adequately charged for his crimes. We also represented the victim in the media.

Most of our prospective clients face some form of workplace harassment and discrimination. Because of this, I routinely advocate for and represent Muslims whose employers denied them reasonable workplace accommodations. This year, I also represented a Muslim woman who alleged her suspension (without pay) and demotion were due to religious and gender-based discrimination. After my representation of her, she received an agreement from her former employer to pay her \_\_\_\_\_\_ for the period of her suspension.



In a similar instance, CAIR helped identify an individual who attacked his neighbor and used slurs that demeaned his faith and national origin.  In another case of workplace harassment, I successfullyrepresented an aggrieved employee whose employer exhibited a pattern of racial, religious, and gender-based discrimination. We are presently in negotiations with the employer to remedy this ongoing set of issues.

The days ahead provide great hope in repairing the fissures in our union. At CAIR, we will continue our work to resist the hate and intolerance fomented by the outgoing administration, and remain steadfast in fighting for the civil rights and liberties of American Muslims, and for an America living up to its self-proclaimed ideals of liberty for all.

## Civic Engagement/ Community Empowerment

### Ahmet Selim Tekelioglu, PhD Director of Outreach and Education

CAIR-Philadelphia believes that civic engagement is the guarantor of civil liberties for American Muslims, and is the key to protecting the community's longterm interests.

In 2020 CAIR-Philadelphia led a comprehensive, sustained civic engagement program focused on getting out the count, getting more Muslims registered to vote, and finally, to convince them that being active in the political process is in their own best interests.

We built alliances and joined Pennsylvania Voices and AAPI Power Caucus to create greater synergy across Pennsylvania among like-minded organizations. These coalitions helped us amplify our civic engagement programs in multiple languages and across multiple counties in our area.

In Philadelphia and beyond, we continued to engage public policy matters, including on the Plain View Project that documented anti-Muslim discourse prevalent among Philadelphia Police Department. We joined other civic and faith leaders for conversations with PPD on Plain View Project and other community concerns around policing and violence.

# **Empowerment and Education**

In 2020, our youth-focused education and equity work continued to grow. We further developed our work with parents and students in Brandywine School District in Delaware and T/E School District as well as with the Department of Education's Inclusion and Equity committee to advocate for greater inclusion for American Muslim students. We have also started a new grant project through PA is Ready! that is enabling us to work with parents and students to i increase participation in school districts in Allentown and Harrisburg hubs.

In 2020, we also continued to invest in our youth community's empowerment through civic engagement. Through unique fellowship programs and paid-volunteer positions, we supported our youth community. Furthermore, we organized several trainings, among which were community organizing trainings delivered by MPower Change, APIVote, Philly Counts, and Center on Civic Engagement. Our dynamic, young board members are also stepping in to help us reach broader audiences. They are building new programs such as a fresh new podcast channel (stay tuned!) where they will address issues that our young community members identified as critical (mental health, Islamophobia, career pathways, drug addiction, among others). In this work, we are benefiting from the youth survey that was recently led by our young board members; the survey shows that our youth need more relevant programming and open conversations. We will take a more detailed look at this survey in the coming days together with you, please stay tuned!

We took a conscious step to empower our community through arts-focused programming to dispel misunderstandings about Islam. Our ongoing work with Contest of the Fruits project at Haverford College brought increased attention not only to the Uyghur culture and heritage but also to the diversity within our community.

Our office was among the leading institutions that put together programming and messaging to encourage honest introspection in our communities on racial inequities and racism. Br. Iftekhar Hussain's much sought after sermon series led to several more focused conversations that are ongoing at multiple levels.

Our empowerment programs also benefited from new partnerships and synergies; with our full membership in leading faith based organizing collective POWER and immigrant and refugee rights coalition PICC, we are better able to advocate on a greater number of issue areas impacting our community. Finally, our relationship with Resolve Philly is enabling us to build further connections with journalists and newsrooms in the Philadelphia area.
