11:00-12:00 PM Session 1: Leadership 101

with Charles Barr (gun violence prevention activist), Wafai Dias, and Dr. Rashidah Abdul-Khabeer (health equity/human rights activist)

This panel features Muslim leaders in our community who are currently doing on the ground work around issues being faced both locally and internationally. They will discuss both their work and how being Muslim comes to play in these spaces. Students will join breakout groups for an interactive campaign activity led by the panelists.

12:00-1:00 PM - Session 2: Racial Justice

In this session we will have a conversation on racism and equity in our communities/schools. Students will learn about critical race theory and how we understand/operationalize in schools. Students will spend time reflecting on their schools/communities and walk away with the skills to know how to speak up for themselves and others to ensure their schools are providing equitable environments for ALL students.

Students will hear from a Philly-native communications professional on the role the media plays in advocacy, address the importance of social media in advocacy, and learn how to use social media to advocate for a cause. Students will work in groups to plan/create their own media campaign.

3:30- 4:30 PM - Session 4: Organizing and Advocacy

with Dr. Hirotoshi Nishikawa (Japanese American Citizens League) & Peter Pedemonti (New Sanctuary Movement)

This panel features leaders who work at social justice organizations in Philadelphia. Panelists will discuss their organizing efforts and how their organization goes about advocating for its target population. Students will participate in a team building/organizing activity.

10:00-11:30 AM - Session 5: School District Leadership & CAIR-Philadelphia Campaigns

Students will reflect on both the positive and negative aspects of their schools to come up with solutions on how to create change for this upcoming school year. Does your school cafeteria have halal options; do you have a place to pray while in school; do your textbooks mention Islam in an accurate way? Students will learn how to advocate for their rights and plan implementation. Students will get the opportunity to see applied activism in the example of ongoing CAIR-Philadelphia campaigns.

11:30-12:30 PM - Session 6: Young Leaders in Muslim History
