

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: ENCOUNTERING ICE

WHAT TO DO IF ICE IS AT THE DOOR

- Stay calm and do **not** open the door. Ask through the door, “Do you have a warrant?”
- Check to see if it is a judicial warrant: Look for a judge’s signature and verify your home address
- ICE may provide administrative warrants, signed by ICE agents or Department of Homeland Security, neither allow for home entry.
- If ICE or the police do not have a judicial warrant, then you do not have to open the door. Once you open the door, you lose certain rights. Do not allow them into your home and tell them that you do not consent to any searches.
- Do not physically resist arrest or provide false information/documentation.
